

## Annual General Meeting - President's report, November 12th, 2024

Good evening to all here present at the Panthers Basketball Albury Annual General Meeting for 2024.

I'd like to begin by acknowledging the Traditional Owners of the lands on which we meet today, the Wiradjuri people and pay my respects to Elders, past and present. I extend that respect to other indigenous people who are present.

A special welcome to our life members of Panthers Basketball Albury, we appreciate your long-term commitment to the club.


We would like to recognise the support of our club sponsors; Findex Albury, Ray White Albury North and Kreativ Dental Albury. together with Howlong Butchers, KBC Plumbing & Pipe Relining, Albury Return & Earn and Thurgoona Training Academy. Their support was committed previously over several years in assisting the club to financial support design and replacement our playing singlets for our players.

We have had a great 2024, with participation levels maintained through a somewhat disjointed 2024. We have worked well to maintain our players and parents' involvement and guided them through the change to Basketball Connect system, which was challenging. We have in the past month been able to manage through the change of using 2 facilities, Lauren Jackson Stadium and Scots school. This has impacted players, coaches, parents, and volunteers, but we appear to have survived!

Once the renovations to Lauren Jackson Stadium are completed, which is a significant investment by our local community to basketball and other indoor sports, I am sure basketball will continue to thrive and attract the next generation of players.

We would like to acknowledge the work of the ABA committee and Albury City Council in facilitating the use of 2 stadiums to ensure basketball competitions could continue whilst the extensive redevelopment of Lauren Jackson Stadium is being completed, expected to be completed by December 2025.

We have 217 players registered as at the current season (146 boys, 71 girls), comprising 18 boys' teams, 9 girls' teams. We have had the drop off in teams from 31 to 27 during the year and into the current season. Some feedback has been put down to disruption of using 2 facilities, as well as the financial impacts, together with having consolidation of some teams where we had continual lack of numbers.



It was really pleasing to see us be able to add another U10 girls' team for season 2 and we were able to find strong demand once we had the commitment from ABA to add the team. This continues to be a focus area for us as a club.

This year we have been focused as a committee on continuing to maintain numbers of participants, engage parents to be involved and looking to put in place additional focus on governance and Child Safety requirements to protect our club members. We plan to introduce and communicate specific policy and documents in 2025 to formalise this. In having compliance around "Child Safeguarding", this helps protect our players, coaches, and volunteers.

Thank you to all our age Group coordinators for 2024, noting a majority of these are board members. If we can seek to encourage some other volunteers into this space, that would help to share the load of the volunteer work required for our club to operate and be successful.

This year with the change in the operating system from "Gameday to Basketball Connect", this has taken a fair focus of time from committee and needed to be managed with our parents. To this end, our Registrar Greer Ashby has been an awesome contributor.


